CONSUMER AWARENESS by Abhilasha Aid Society

Abhilasha Aid Society organized two days Consumer Awareness Camp at Village Pali. Approximately 150 participants attend the Consumer Awareness Camp from different parts of areas. In this program experts from different sectors invited for aware to participants about consumer rights and other aspects like health.

CHILD EDUCATION by Abhilasha Aid Society

Through our program we encourage parents to send their children to schools and allow them to continue their studies until they complete at least their senior secondary school education. To enable poor parents to increase their family income for their children's education, we also arrange for imparting vocational skills to adult family members.

Regulation of the evening classes and also the distribution of stationeries continued . We also held few stage programs were both children and women prepared some educational plays and other programs.

Every day, two hours in the afternoon, we conduct free tuition and teaching to almost 300 children. We teach them class wise and prepare them for examination. Many Children who are completed their school education still they visit the center.





WOMEN EMPOWERMENT by Abhilasha Aid Society

Indian women have usually occupied a lower status in the family as well as in the social milieu. It is a fact that women continue to be discriminated against different factors such as sex-ratio, maternal mortality- which is the highest in the world- illiteracy and poor socioeconomic status. Crime against women in India is on the rise. In our society women are expected to perform their roles as a mother, sister and wife. Her social responsibility seems to be confined to be reproduction and socially approved domain where, as a women, she is deprived on her basic minimum rights. Gender inequality manifests in many forms in all spheres of life such as social, economics, health, participation in decision making for children's education, daughter's marriage, on in politics.

Under Women Empowerment by Abhilasha Aid Society

We have setup with limited computer and we are in need of 15 more computer. However there will be around 20 to 25 students in each class/each shift. At least 10 to 12 computer will help us to solve the current problems. But in near future we expect each computer for each student. 20 girls and boys got basic computer training and they are able to operate the computer without anybody's help.







HEALTH CHECKUP CAMP by Abhilasha Aid Society

NGOs like ours now work closely with the Department of Health and Family Welfare for improving the condition of public healthcare facilities. The Department now has some set goals, such as -

Maintain a regular supply of essential drugs.

Improve the infrastructure of the basic health units.

Execution of healthcare programmes.

Organize regular inoculation programmes like Hepatitis B, polio etc.

Work towards establishment of medical education institutions and research, nursing schools etc.

With the gradual improvement of the government's healthcare facilities, especially in the rural areas, we also have put more emphasis in creating awareness amongst the people to take advantage of these facilities in greater numbers.

The organization provided free health checkup to the poor, needy women and children. The family planning operations both male and female are done by doctor's whit the nominal charges of Rs. 100/- each patient. The camp also provided proper information to the pregnant women and

infants about nutritious food and medicines.
